## **SPEEDWATCH REPORT**

Parish Council February 2019

During January we ran 16 sessions, totalling 12.5 hours, that recorded 63 speeding vehicles from 2814 vehicles that passed during the sessions, that equates to 2.6% of passing vehicles that were speeding during the sessions, the fastest speed recorded was 47mph.

A further 4 sessions were cancelled due to operator unavailability and a change of holiday arrangements by one operator.

Three of the recorded vehicles were shown to have no tax and/or MOT.

The average accuracy for the month was 98.6%, this was because one vehicle returned as a colour error, probably a company vehicle that has been resprayed in company colours and the colour change not notified to DVLA, so the colour we entered did not match the listed colour.

Between 14<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> January the National Police Chief's Council (NPCC) held a Speed Campaign, we were not asked to do anything specific during the two weeks apart from running as many sessions as possible.

Note; NPCC was formerly known as the Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO)

If we do not need to cancel any sessions we will complete 17 sessions this month and a potential 20 in March.
