What works are taking place?

We will be carrying out carriageway resurfacing works on A265 Straight Half Mile, Etchingham.

When will these works start?

Work will start on Wednesday 22nd July 2020 and continue until Friday 31st July 2020.

Road closure information

A265 Etchingham will be closed to through traffic from B2096 Battle Road to A21 London Road between 8pm & 6am each night.

We will be working at the section highlighted red.

Diversion

Traffic will be diverted via A265, B2096 Battle Road, A271 North Trade Road, A2100 London Road, A21 Johns Cross Roundabout, Robertsbridge Bypass, A21 London Road, A265 Station Road & vice versa.

Information for local people

Vehicle access: The road will be closed to through traffic. This is for your safety and the safety of our workers. If you do need vehicle access then please discuss this with the team on site. We will try to give access where we can but there may be long delays whilst we make the area safe. We will always allow access for emergency vehicles. Pedestrian access will be maintained.

Weather: If it rains, we might be delayed in our works. We will keep you updated with any changes via advance warning signs.

Parking: Please park your vehicle off road or in another location, otherwise your vehicle may be towed away. There will be 'no parking' signs and cones on site to advise where parking is restricted.

Buses: We apologise if our works cause disruption to your bus service. Please check with the bus company for any alterations to the service during this time.

Bin Collections: We have informed your local council about these works. Your local District or Borough Council will let you know if there are any changes to your collection.
