

# Speedwatch Report

*Parish Council 18<sup>th</sup> November 2021*

October was a fairly quiet month for roadside sessions, we currently still only have three operators available, we have one more volunteer able to resume sessions from the last week of November, and another is hoping his continued recovery from health issues will enable his return in January.

We ran 15 sessions during the month, totalling 7.5 hours, those sessions recorded 71 speeding vehicles from 1858 passing vehicles, the fastest speed recorded was 47mph. One of the sessions recorded 16 speeding from 91 passing vehicles (17.6%). Five of the vehicles had been recorded by the Etchingham group on previous sessions three of those had also been recorded by other groups (Burwash, Broad Oak and Hawkhurst), one was also reported for abusive gestures as well as speeding. *Note; We can also report abusive behaviour even if the vehicle was not speeding.*

A further five sessions were cancelled, three because of rain and two because an operator was unexpectedly unavailable. If we do not need to cancel any we have 26 sessions set for November.

## **Notes from the overview of all Sussex groups for October;**

There are 289 registered CSW groups in Sussex, 70 of those groups were active during the month, running 446 roadside sessions, using 1,072 volunteer hours, those sessions generated 5,185 speeding reports, 111 of the reported vehicles had no MOT and 9 were on a SORN so should not have been on the road. *The full Overview Report can be viewed on the Parish Council website.*
