There are currently 299 registered CSW groups in Sussex, 187 of these are Parish Council Run Groups.

During this month 62 groups have completed sessions on the roads of Sussex.

This month Sussex Police have recorded 30 reports on Speedwatch sessions / visits to support Community Groups.

Last month CSW group's generated 3,771 reports through Op Crackdown of those reports are reports of abuse to groups from drivers.

In the last 12 months 60,938 reports were generated, compared to 38,625 for the same period last year.

Last month CSW volunteers recorded 87 vehicles passing with no MOT and 10 SORN.

This month CSW volunteers have completed 344 roadside sessions in Sussex.

This month the number of Force volunteer hours given by groups was 794.

The Sussex Police repeat offenders compliance rate currently stands at 93.24%, this ratio is based on drivers who have received the first letter from us not going back through the CSW system within a 12 month period, (this data is based on group record input).

New monthly CSW virtual Coordinators meetings now held to enable groups and Parish Councils to establish a collaborative working network, this also enables SSRP to give any updates and feedback constructively to the groups. Next meeting 13.00hrs on Friday 25th February 2022.

Groups are now permitted to use Body Worn Video, the Sussex Policy for this can be found under the help section in all Coordinators accounts and Police Station Documentation. The effective date is 28th January 2022, we hope this will help with the high levels of abuse given to the groups by motorists. The kits initially will be funded by the groups if they wish to use, however we intend by end of February to have some available for those groups that we can identify from stats have an urgent need.

Councillors workshops are now being introduced on a 1 hour per month basis for Road Safety / CSW related topics, the first one is February 8th at 19.00 – 20.00hrs and is based around SID's (Speed Indicator Devices and how to use them effectively), anyone from Parish / Town Council is welcome, to join just send Name, Email Address, and Parish name to csw@sussex.police.uk
