The Sussex Police repeat offenders compliance rate currently stands at 93.15%, this ratio is based on drivers who have received the first letter from us not going back through the CSW system within a 12 month period, (this data is based on group record input).

The kits initially will be funded by the groups if they wish to use their own, we have some available for those groups that we can identify from stats have an urgent need but unable to get funding.
